Mullen It Over

FOR EIGHT YEARS President George W. Bush and the White House press corps have made Crawford part of a story. On Sunday, June 8th, the people of Crawford will tell their own version—in their own town.

“CRAWFORD”, a documentary film, directed and produced by David Modigliani, tells what happens to the 705 citizens of Crawford when the president moves to town. This documentary premiered at SxSW Film Festival in Austin this spring and has sold out screenings at every festival since its SxSW premiere.

The film has been praised in VARIETY, Texas Monthly, Film Threat, Politico.com and Premiere, applauded by Jake Gyllenhaal and Richard Linklater and linked to by Frank Rich of the New York Times.

CRAWFORD will now screen where shooting began three years ago. Live Action Projects partners with the world-renowned Alamo Drafthouse Rolling Road Show to bring Crawford to the big screen on the Crawford football field, Sunday, June 8 at 8:30 p.m. It will be a night under the stars, as attendees view the movie on a 50 ft. screen. All of the major characters in the film will be present, along with the filming team.

Cost of the screening is \$10 general admission and \$5 for Crawford residents (with ID). The audience is encouraged to come early and enjoy concessions from the Crawford Booster Club to benefit Crawford Schools. Bring your picnic blankets and chairs and enjoy a view from the field.

Even eight years later, it is still amazing to me that our little area of the state has been pushed to the national forefront due to President George W. Bush choosing to purchase ranch land here and make this his Western White House.

This documentary is a very honest look at the closeknit community of Crawford. Come out Sunday night and enjoy an evening under the stars.

NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF APPLICATION AND INTENT TO OBTAIN WATER QUALITY PERMIT RENEWAL

PERMIT NO. WQ0010656001

APPLICATION. City of Crawford, P.O. Box 7, Crawford, Texas 76638-0007, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) to renew Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) Permit No. WQ0010656001 (EPA I.D. No. TX0054666) to authorize the discharge of treated wastewater at a volume not to exceed a daily average flow of 90,000 gallons per day. The domestic wastewater treatment facility is located approximately 1,000 feet south of Farm-to-Market Road 185 and approximately 3,000 feet southeast of the intersection of State Highway 185 and State Highway 317 in the City of Crawford in McLennan County, Texas. The discharge route is from the plant site to a dry branch; thence to Wasp Creek; thence to Tonk Creek; then to Middle Bosque/South Bosque River. TCEQ received this application on April 17, 2008. The permit application is available for viewing and copying at City of Crawford, City Hall, 6719 North Lonestar Parkway, Crawford, Texas.

ADDITIONAL NOTICE. TCEQ's Executive Director has determined the application is administratively complete and will conduct a technical review of the application. After technical review of the application is complete, the Executive Director may prepare a draft permit and will issue a preliminary decision on the application. **Notice of the Application and Preliminary Decision will be published and mailed to those who are on the county-wide mailing list and to those who are on the mailing list for this application. That notice will contain the deadline for submitting public comments.**

PUBLIC COMMENT/PUBLIC MEETING. You may submit public comments or request a public meeting on this application. The purpose of a

public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit comments or to ask questions about the application. TCEQ will hold a public meeting if the Executive Director determines that there is a significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING. After the deadline for submitting public comments, the Executive Director will consider all timely comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. **Unless the application is directly referred for a contested case hearing, the response to comments, and the Executive Director's decision on the application, will be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments and to those persons who are on the mailing list for this application. If comments are received, the mailing will also provide instructions for requesting reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision and for requesting a contested case hearing.** A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.

TO REQUEST A CONTESTED CASE HEARING, YOU MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS IN YOUR REQUEST: your name, address, phone number; applicant's name and proposed permit number; the location and distance of your property/activities relative to the proposed facility; a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the facility in a way not common to the general public; and, the statement ("I/we) request a contested case hearing." If the request for contested case hearing is filed on behalf of a group or association, the request must designate the group's representative for receiving future correspondence; identify an individual member of the group who would be adversely affected by the proposed facility or activity; provide the information discussed above regarding the affected member's location and distance from the facility or activity; explain how and why the member would be affected; and explain how the interests the group seeks to protect are relevant to the group's purpose.

Following the close of all applicable comment and request periods, the Executive Director will forward the application and any

requests for reconsideration or for a contested case hearing to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting.

The Commission will only grant a contested case hearing on disputed issues of fact that are relevant and material to the Commission's decision on the application. Further, the Commission will only grant a hearing on issues that were raised in timely filed comments that were not subsequently withdrawn. **TCEQ may act on an application to renew a permit for discharge of wastewater without providing an opportunity for a contested case hearing if certain criteria are met.**

If you submit public comments, a request for a contested case hearing or a reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision, you will be added to the mailing list for this specific application to receive future public notices mailed by the Office of the Chief Clerk. In addition, you may request to be placed on: (1) the permanent mail-

Fire up the grill Summer is here

It won't be long before we are experiencing scorching weather now that our calendars have us in June. Thought I would bring some great grilling recipes to keep us from heating up the kitchens and enjoy the great outdoors. Start up your coals early in the evening, because it is a perfect time to sit out with your family while grilling up these delicious recipes. The smoke may even help ward off those pesky mosquitoes.

- 1 cup chopped tomato
- 1/4 cup finely chopped onion
- 1/2 cup green pepper slices
- 1/2 cup (2 oz.) shredded cheddar cheese

Preheat grill to medium hot. Grill chicken breasts until done. (Chicken breasts may also be broiled or baked, according to package directions.) Combine mayonnaise and picante sauce in a small bowl. Use a wire whisk to blend in lime juice. Set aside.

Place lettuce, tomato, onion and bell pepper in a glass serving bowl. Slice cooked chicken breasts into strips and arrange on top of salad ingredients. Add dressing and garnish with cheese. Add hot flour tortillas or tortilla chips.

ENSALADA POLLO OLE BBQ CHICKEN BREAST

- 4 boneless chicken breasts, barbecue flavor
- 1/4 cup mayonnaise
- 1/4 cup picante sauce
- 1 Tbsp. fresh lime juice
- 4 cups torn lettuce leaves

GARDEN VEGGIES AND SUMMER DIP W/BBQ CHICKEN HALVES

2-4 Split Fryers, barbecue flavor

Preheat grill to medium hot. Place split fryers skin side up, on the grill. Cook, covered with grill lid, about 15 minutes. Turn chicken and cook, covered with grill lid, 10-15 minutes more. Move to cooler area of grill and continue to cook slowly 20-25 minutes, brushing lightly with vegetable oil as needed to prevent drying. Cook slowly to an internal temperature of 170 degrees or until juices run clear when sliced; chicken should be tender when tested with a fork and joint should move freely to indicate doneness. Serve an assortment of garden fresh vegetables with Summer Dip while chicken is grilling.

SUMMER DIP

- 1 (8-oz.) carton sour cream
- 1 cup plain nonfat yogurt
- 1 (14-oz.) envelope vegetable soup mix
- 2 tsps. minced fresh dill (or 1/4 tsp. dried dill weed)

Combine all ingredients in a covered bowl. Refrigerate at least 6 hours to blend flavors.

Menu idea: Grilled barbecued chicken, garden veggies with Summer Dip, Grilled Corn on the Cob, Ranch Style Beans, Grilled Texas Toast and Homemade Peach Ice Cream.

ORIENTAL GRILLED CHICKEN SALAD W/TERIYAKI CHICKEN BREAST

- 4 boneless chicken breasts,

Teriyaki flavor
1 pkg. Uncle Ben's wild rice mix, prepared according to package

- 1 cup chopped unpeeled apple
- 1 cup seedless grapes, halved
- 1/2 cup chopped celery
- 3/4 cup slivered almonds, divided

1 small can chopped water chestnuts, drained
dressing (recipe follows)

Preheat grill to medium hot. Grill chicken breasts until done. Cool and dice. (Chicken breast may also be baked, broiled or pan-grilled.) In a large bowl, toss together prepared and cooled wild rice, diced chicken, apple, grapes, celery, 1/2 the slivered almonds, and water chestnuts. Set aside.

Dressing: Mix together 1 cup mayonnaise, 1/2 teaspoon seasoned salt and 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon. Add dressing to chicken mixture and toss lightly. Cover and chill about 30 minutes to blend flavors. To serve, line a glass bowl with lettuce or spinach leaves. Spoon chicken mixture into bowl and sprinkle with remaining 1/4 cup of slivered almonds. Serves 6.

TEXAS 2-STEP APPLE CRISP

So tasty, no need to dress it up, but a dollop of whipped cream dusted with cinnamon is a scrumptious topper.

- 6 cooking apples, cored, peeled and sliced
- 1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 cup brown sugar, packed
- 1 T. cinnamon
- 1/2 t. nutmeg
- 1/4 t. ground ginger
- 3/4 cup butter, softened

Garnish: vanilla ice cream, whipped topping, maraschino cherries

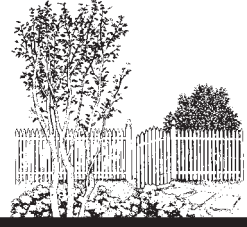
Arrange apples sliced in a greased slow cooker; set aside. Combine remaining ingredients except garnish in a bowl. Mix well and sprinkle over apples, pressing down lightly. Cover and cook on high setting for 4 hours, until apples are tender. Garnish as desired. Serves 6 to 8.

Lawn & Garden Questions & Answers

QUESTION: I had fungus patches in my St. Augustine last fall and I think it is still there. The grass is thin and not full and the area looks like it is spreading. What should I do? Heather Barrow-Waco

ANSWER: If it is active fungus the grass will begin to die and the grass at the edge of the spots will begin to yellow before it turns brown and dies. If it is just thin and not as full as normal, it can take most of the spring and into early summer for the grass to recover from a major fungus attack. You can treat again with a good systemic fungicide and fertilize with a slow release lawn food.

QUESTION: I was weeding my flower bed and some of the

plants had some kind of "foam" on the stems. The plants seem to be doing ok but is this something I need to be concerned about. Henry Abbott-China Spring

ANSWER: It is not a major concern. What you have is called a spittle bug. The insect feeds on plant sap and builds the ball of "foam" around itself to hide from predators. You can treat with any all purpose insect spray.

It Happened This Week . . . 10, 20, 30, 40, 50, 60, 70, 80 Years Ago

A look back at McGregor's Past

JUNE 3, 1928—

Three Mcgregorites received degrees from Baylor University. They were Misses Jane Connally, Anna Frances Anderson and Grady Elms and Clois Mansker.

Receiving degrees from Texas A&M were K.D. Willingham and Ray Scruggs.

Rural electric rates for McLennan County project were announced by John M. Carmody, administrator of the REA. First 25 kwh or less was \$2.45 per month. The next 50 kwh per month was billed at 6.0 cents per kwh. Next 125 kwh per month at 3.0 cents per kwh and over 200 kwh per month was billed at 1.5 cents per kwh.

JUNE 8, 1938—

State Ranger Ed McMordie, W.W. Hollingsworth of the Coryell Sheriff's Dept. and Constable J.W. Lindsey made several raids. One to a farm house east of McGregor. They destroyed 40 gallons of rye mash. A raid on the west side of town captured 20 gallons of beer. Another raid got 80 bottles of beer and 30 gallons of corn chop mash.

Smith's Drug Store busily engaged in the installation of a new air cooler Frigadaire cream cabinet.

JUNE 4, 1948—

Chamber of Commerce directors voted to sponsor the 10 Edition of the McGregor Rodeo. Chamber members secured the services of the Vick Brothers to assist. These men were experienced rodeo men and Chamber members were looking forward to the best show ever.

Mayor Amsler proclaimed the week as Clean Up Week, as it was customary for McGregor to have an annual summer cleanup.

Honored with a wedding shower was Amy Lou Vowel. Miss Vowel was the bride-elect of Vernon Schmidt.

McGregor Pastry Shop owners Mr. and Mrs. Gaither, advertised they would be moving into their new shop on June 14. It was on South Main, just across from the King Service Station.

Mirror employee, Thomas Mooney, received his B.A. Degree in Journalism from Baylor.

JUNE 6, 1958—

The McGregor Jaycees Road-e-o awards were displayed by co-chairmen Ray Hennig and Jack Keltner. Thirty three teenagers from McGregor, Moody and Crawford came out to prove their driving skills at the parking lot at First National Bank. McGregor Jaycee president was Harold Lehrmann.

E.C. Fulp, a McGregor High School graduate, was to compete with nine other boys for the Texas FFA President at the State Convention in San Antonio. Ten of the State's 40,000 FFA members were chosen each year for this honor. The winner becomes president and the other nine become vice presidents.

MHS band majorettes for the next fall were chosen. They were Kay Harrison, Betty Lou Upchurch, Carol Westerfeld, Shirley Zacharias, Lynda White, Natishua Mote and Beverly Collins.

Mr. and Mrs. G.W. Lee returned home from Ohio, where they went to drive back a new ambulance. It was the latest thing built in ambulances.

Dixie Lee Whisenant became the bride of Earl Whitmore at College Avenue Baptist Church.

The Willow Way Card Club held a "Tacky Party". Pictured were Dorothy Patrick, Betty Hale, Nancy Nabors, Mary Lynn Neff, Helen Braum, Edith Smith, Virginia Thomas, Joann Phillips, Kathleen Lillard, Mary Lou Lella, Annette Wallis, Betty McDonald and Winnis Curtis.

Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs was featured at the Texas Theatre.

JUNE 6, 1968—

James T. Baker, 35 year old McGregor elementary school principal, was promoted to McGregor ISD Superintendent. Baker came to McGregor in 1966.

The swimming pool at Rolling Hills Country Club was completed and ready for its first summer.

McGregor voters would be going to the polls over the weekend to decide whether a six man aldermanic form of government would replace the three man commission form. Running for a place on the city council were Lee Ardell, Al Wolf, Jack Dawson, Joseph Williams, Billy Clearman,

G.W. Sanders and Foster Williams. The Jaycees led the push in changing the form of city government.

Miss Gail Grantham married Charles La Grone.

Lois Williams was installed Worthy Advisor of McGregor's Chapter of the Rainbow Girls.

DorVe price for shampoo and set without teasing was \$2.50. With teasing it was \$3.00. Operators were Alice Wilson, Becky White, Pauline Ortega and Lola Solero.

JUNE 1, 1978—

A committee was appointed to study ambulance service for the area at the first meeting of MOC mayors and interested citizens. Committee members were John Blake, Billy Mangum, Bo Golson, Carl Spitzer, Martha Moyer, F.A. Morris and Felix Morris.

McGregor Chamber of Commerce was sponsoring a June Sellabration. Businesses were giving away merchandise and prize money to attract shoppers to downtown.

Postage increased again. First class stamps went from 13 cents to 15 cents.

MHS seniors receiving scholarships were Tina Drew, Paul Fox, Deborah Fitzhugh, Kelly Fisk, Debra Snyder, Scott McKenzie, Jackie Kilpatrick, Karen Britton, Dana Pomeranke, Annette Neuman, Otto Teague, Otha Kelley, Tana Carpenter, Lisa Farrar, Avonda Waits, Rodney Morgan and Domingo Miramontez.

Charles Von Staden and Annette Neuman were named Mr. and Miss MHS.

G.W. Lee, president of Lee Funeral Home, announced the sale of Lee Funeral Homes in McGregor and Moody to Charles Cole, Jr. The funeral homes would be known as Cole Funeral Home.

Don Cantrell announced the purchase of the McGregor law firm, Amsler, Amsler and Associates. The new firm would be called Amsler, Amsler and Cantrell.

MHS twirlers were announced for the fall. They were Andrea Ainsworth (head twirler), Marsha Linville, Jennifer Ar buckle (drum major), Jonida Head, Amy Kruse, Susan Miller and Jackie Cox.

Sandra Spitznburger re-

ceived an award for 12 years perfect attendance.

JUNE 2, 1988—

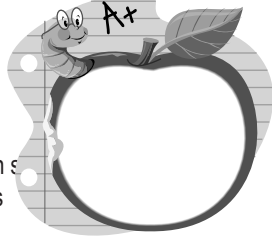

The younger boys will meet from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. and the older boys will meet from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m.

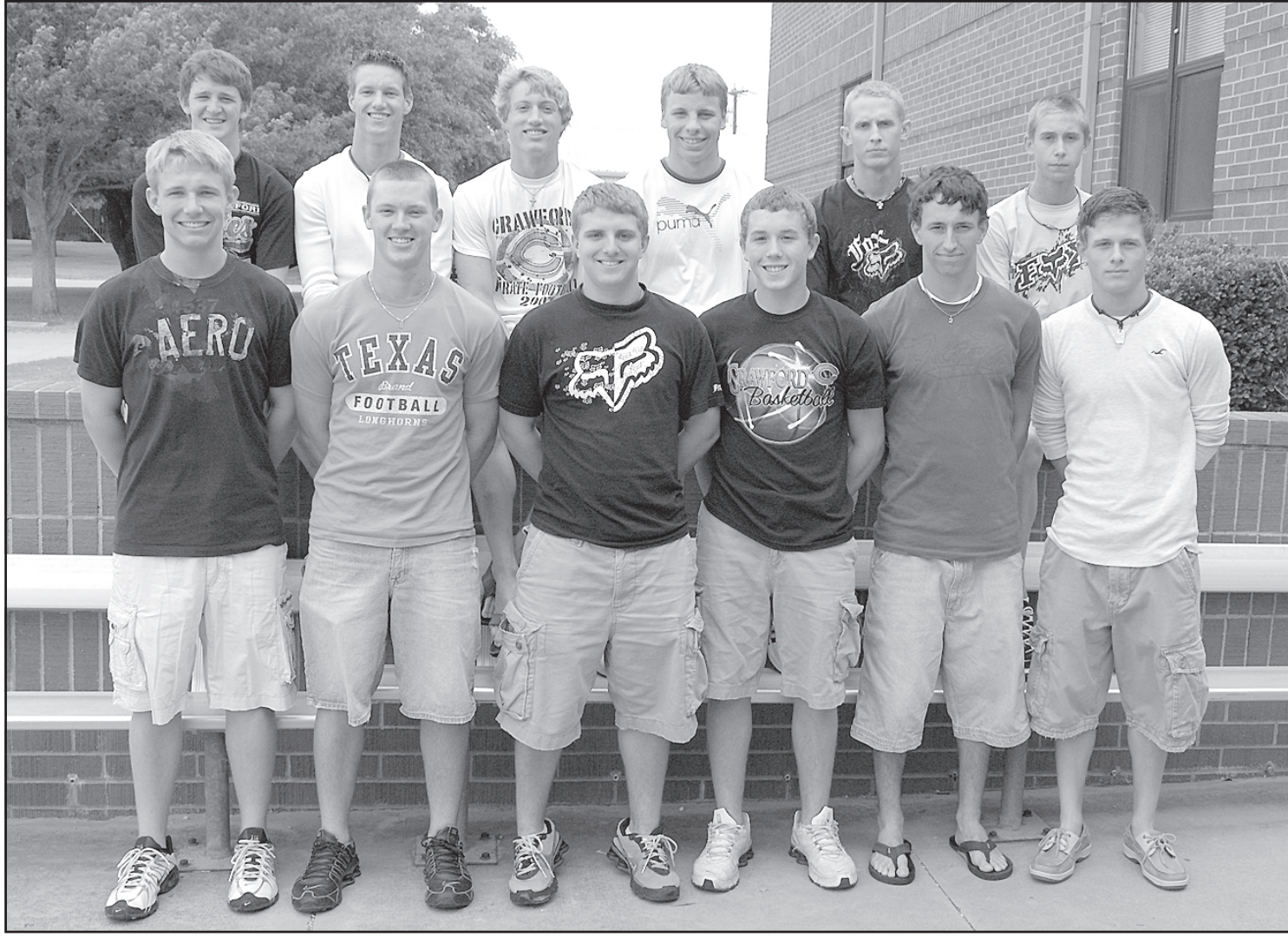
