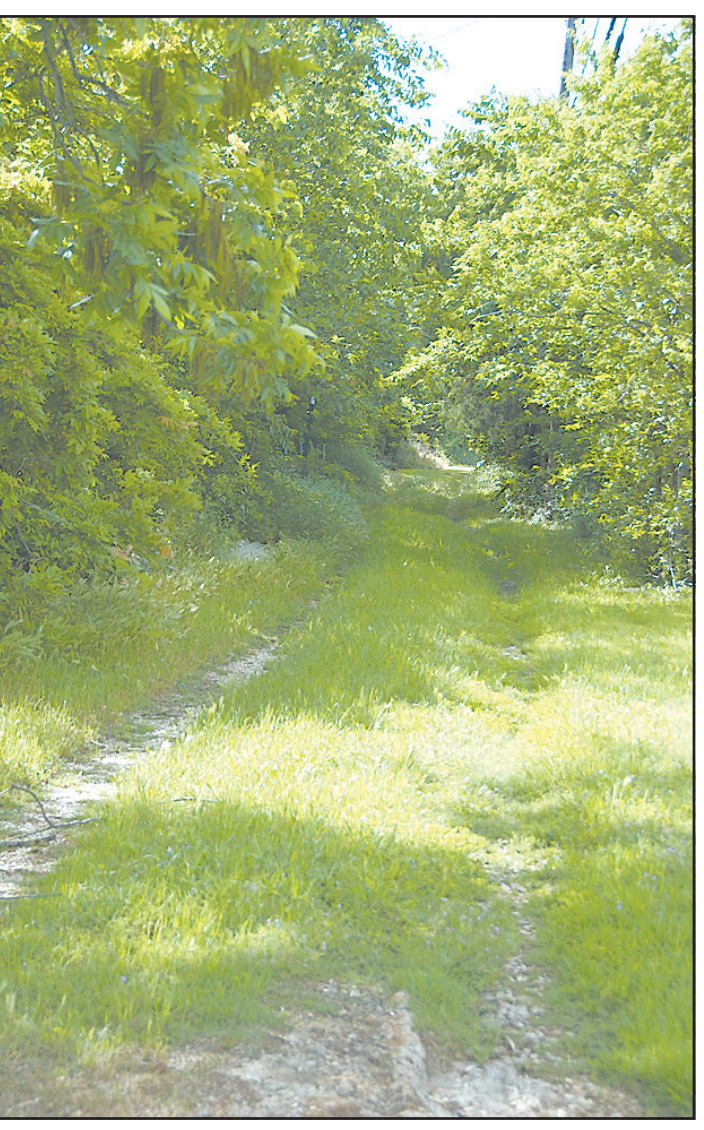

Punch and cake were served, an impressive banner was signed by survivors, many encouraging stories were shared, and one purpose was stated—to defeat cancer! "We hate cancer!" Raydean and Cindy Damon both feel strongly about this disease. Raydean's husband, James, was diagnosed with prostate cancer in

1991, and thought he beat it, but he succumbed to lung cancer in 1995. Raydean and Cindy, her daughter, have been involved with Relay for eight years—they go to church with "The Wild Bunch." Tony Ocampo is the Ferguson Enterprises team captain. While an MHS PAL, he became involved in Relay for Life, and believes that "cancer affects everyone." Ferguson has held a bake sale, a frozen cookie sale, and teamed with the talented MHS art class who designed their team shirt.

## Two trustee races on Saturday ballots

Two contested races will be decided this Saturday—for Crawford and Oglesby School Trustees. There will be no election in McGregor on May 9th. An email has been circulating stating there is a Constitutional Amendment concerning Homestead Exemptions. This is a hoax. While Texans will go to the polls on May 9 to decide many local issues, there are no statewide propositions on the ballot that day, according to Secretary of State Hope Andrade. "Our office has been contacted by many citizens that received or heard of the email," said Andrade. "We want to make sure the people have correct information and are prepared to vote on the issues before them. Many cities, school districts and other local entities will be holding important elections, but there are no statewide constitutional amendments on the May 9 ballot." The amendment in question was passed in a special election in May 2007. Crawford ISD trustee election attracted five candidates to fill three positions and Oglesby had six candidates filing for three positions. Incumbents running for reelection in Crawford include

Charlie Kasparian and Terri Bukowski. They are being challenged by Marvin Hickey, Brit-tany Villa and Ken Wilkins. Crawford polling place is at the school from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Incumbents in the Oglesby School Board election are Bruce Pomerence and Mike Gomez. They are challenged by Rebecca Schultz, Ed Newman and Randy McClinton. Mark Luckie was the only candidate filing for the unexpired term on the board, which he has been serving. McGregor City and School, Crawford City and Oglesby City will not be having elections since there are no opposed candidates. McGregor City unopposed for election include Andrew Henderson-Ward One, David Taylor-Ward Three and Frank Leos-Ward 5 (at-large). Carolyn Lillard and Frank Graves, Jr. are unopposed candidates for McGregor School Board. Unopposed candidates for the City of Crawford election are Mayor David Posten and councilmen Brent Meyer and Donny Bruce. Unopposed candidates for the City of Oglesby are Mayor Kenneth Goodwin and Melissa Wells. One council position will be appointed after the election.

## Bosque Family Dental offers cancer screening

Driven by the increased incidence of oral cancer and its link to HPV-16, oral cancer now kills one person every hour of every day. Based on five year mortality rates, oral cancer is now more deadly than many more common types of cancer, such as breast, cervical, prostate, colon and renal cancer.

Ironically, the spike has occurred despite decreased use of tobacco products.



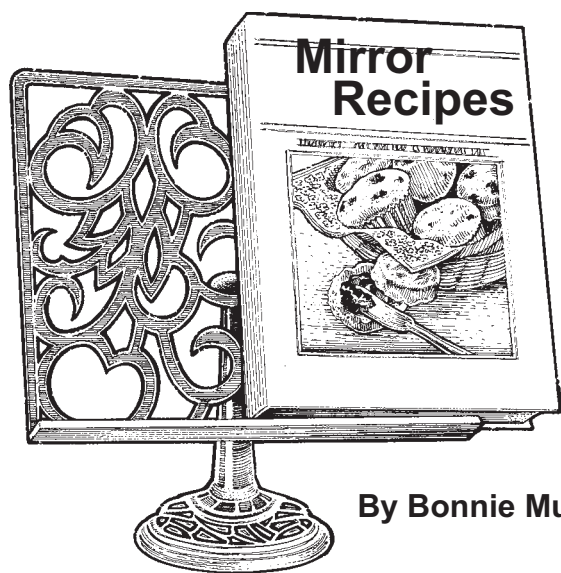

# Mother's Day treats

Mother's Day is Sunday, and what better way to pamper Mom than making breakfast, or better yet, taking care of all the cooking that day. Cleaning up after your culinary endeavors is the icing on the cake.

Here are a few easy recipes to try out on Mom and the family. For those enjoying making scratch cakes, there is a delicious recipe—Caramel Cream Cake. It isn't difficult, but it does take time. It's worth it!

1/2 cup milk  
1 tsp. salt  
1/2 tsp. pepper  
Unroll crescent roll dough; press on bottom and partially up sides of a 13-x 9-inch baking dish; press perforations to seal. Bake at 375 degrees for 5 minutes. Cook sausage in a large skillet over medium-high heat, stirring until sausage crumbles and is no longer pink. Drain well and sprinkle evenly over crust.

Prepare hash browns according to package directions; spoon evenly over sausage. Sprinkle cheese evenly over hash browns (cover and chill up to 24 hours, if desired). Whisk eggs and next 3 ingredients; pour evenly over cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 to 35 minutes or until set. Serves 8.

### BREAKFAST PIZZA

1 (8-oz) can refrigerated crescent rolls  
1 lb. hot ground pork sausage  
1 (32-oz) package frozen hash browns with onions and peppers  
1 cup (4 oz) shredded Cheddar cheese  
4 large eggs

**ENCHILADAS**  
2 cups diced cooked ham (about 3/4 lb.)  
1/2 cup chopped green onions  
10 (8-inch) flour tortillas  
2 cups (8 oz.) shredded Cheddar cheese, divided  
6 large eggs  
2 cups half-and-half  
1/2 tsp. salt  
1/4 tsp ground red pepper  
Sprinkle ham and green onions evenly down the center of each tortilla; top each with 2 T. shredded cheese. Roll up tortillas, and place seam sides down in a lightly greased 13 x 9-inch baking dish. Whisk together eggs and next 3 ingredients in a large bowl. Pour mixture evenly over tortillas. Cover and chill at least 8 hours. Remove from refrigerator, and let stand 30 minutes at room temperature before baking. Bake, covered, at 350 degrees for 20 minutes; uncover and bake 15 more minutes. Sprinkle with remaining 3/4 cup Cheddar cheese and bake 3 to 4 more minutes or until cheese melts. Let stand 10 minutes before serving. Serves 8-10.

### SAUSAGE-CHEESE MUFFINS

1 (1 lb) package ground pork sausage  
3 cups all-purpose baking mix  
1 1/2 cups (6 oz.) shredded Cheddar cheese  
1 (10 3/4 oz.) can condensed cheese soup  
3/4 cup water  
Cook sausage in a large skillet, stirring until it crumbles and is no longer pink. Drain and cool. Combine sausage, baking mix and shredded cheese in a large bowl;

make a well in center of mixture. Stir together soup and 3/4 cup water; add to sausage mixture, stirring just until dry ingredients are moistened. Spoon into lightly greased muffin pans, filling to top of cups. Bake at 375 degrees for 20 to 25 minutes or until lightly browned. Makes 15 muffins.

### CHICKEN COBBLER CASSEROLE

(for an easy, quick lunch—serve with a green salad tossed with fresh citrus, sliced avocados, toasted pecans and bottled raspberry vinaigrette—YUM)  
6 T. melted butter, divided  
4 cups cubed sourdough rolls  
1/3 cup grated Parmesan cheese  
2 T. chopped fresh parsley  
2 medium-size sweet onions, sliced  
1 (8-oz) package sliced fresh mushrooms  
1 cup buttermilk or 1 cup white wine  
1 (10 3/4-oz) can cream of mushroom soup 1/2 cup drained and chopped jarred roasted red bell peppers  
2 1/2 cups shredded cooked chicken  
Toss 4 T. melted butter with next 3 ingredients; set aside. Saute onions in remaining 2 T. butter in a large skillet over medium high heat 15 minutes or until golden brown. Add mushrooms and saute 5 minutes. Stir in buttermilk (or wine) and next 3 ingredients; cook, stirring constantly, 5 minutes or until bubbly. Spoon mixture into a lightly greased 9-inch square or 11-x 7-inch baking dish; top evenly with bread mixture. Bake at 400 degrees for 15 minutes or until casserole is golden brown. Serves 4.

### CARAMEL CREAM CAKE

1 cup finely chopped sweetened flaked coconut  
1 recipe Pecan Pie Cake Batter  
1 recipe Pecan Pie Filling  
1 recipe Cream Cheese Frosting  
1 cup finely chopped pecans, toasted  
1 cup sweetened flaked coconut, toasted  
Stir 1 cup finely chopped coconut into Pecan Pie Cake Batter; spoon batter into 3 greased and floured 9-inch round cakepans. Bake at 350 degrees for 25 minutes or until a wooden pick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool in pans on wire racks 10 minutes; remove from pans and cool completely on wire racks.  
Spread Pecan Pie Filling between layers. Spread Cream Cheese Frosting on top and sides of cake. Sprinkle top and sides with toasted pecans and toasted coconut.

### PECAN PIE CAKE BATTER

1/2 cup butter, softened  
1/2 cup shortening  
2 cups sugar  
5 large eggs, separated  
1 T. vanilla extract  
2 cups all-purpose flour  
1 tsp. baking soda  
1 cup buttermilk  
1 cup finely chopped pecans, toasted  
Beat 1/2 cup butter and shortening at medium speed with an electric mixer until fluffy; gradually add sugar, beating well until blended. Add egg yolks, 1 at a time, beating just until blended after each addition. Stir in vanilla.

Combine flour and baking soda; add to butter mixture alternately with buttermilk, beginning and ending with flour mixture. Beat at low speed until blended after each addition. Stir in pecans.

Beat egg whites at medium speed until stiff peaks form; fold one-third of egg whites into batter. Gently fold in remaining beaten egg whites just until blended. Use immediately as directed in recipe (*adding chopped coconut*). Makes about 6 cups

### PECAN PIE FILLING

1/2 cup firmly packed dark brown sugar  
3/4 cup dark corn syrup  
1/3 cup cornstarch  
4 egg yolks  
1 1/2 cups half-and-half  
1/8 tsp. salt  
3 T butter  
1 tsp. vanilla extract  
Whisk together first 6 ingredients in a heavy 3-qt. saucepan until smooth. Bring mixture to a boil over medium heat, whisking constantly; boil 1 minute or until thickened. Remove from heat; whisk in butter and vanilla. Place sheet of wax paper directly on surface of mixture to prevent a film from forming, and chill 4 hours. Makes about 3 cups.

### CREAM CHEESE FROSTING

1 (8 oz) package cream cheese, softened  
1 (16-oz) package powdered sugar  
1 tsp. vanilla extract  
Beat butter and cream cheese at medium speed with an electric mixer until creamy. Gradually add powdered sugar, beating at low speed until blended; stir in vanilla. Makes about 3 cups.

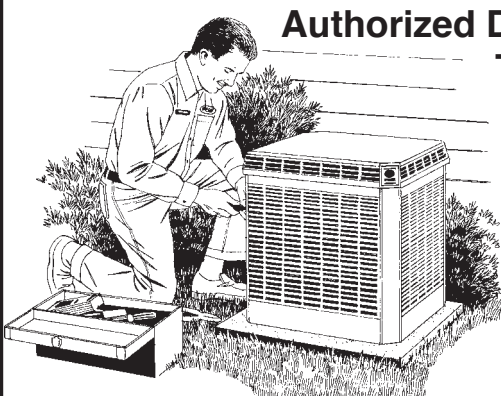
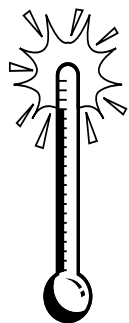

# Athletes preparing for Regional Track meet set for May 15 and 16 at Tarleton State University

With the recent news coverage of the swine flu outbreak, it was first announced on the morning of Wednesday, April 29 that the Regional Track Meets throughout the state of Texas had been canceled, but that has all since changed.

A news release the following day from the University Interscholastic League began that after collaborating with University of Texas officials and the 20 UIL regional track meet hosts, the UIL has tentatively rescheduled the regional track meets to take place after interscholastic competition resumes on May 11.

The Regional Track Meet will be held May 15 and 16 at Tarleton State University at Stephenville. See table for list of events and when they will take place.

The statement also announced that the state track meet

had been rescheduled for June 4-6 at Myers Stadium at the University of Texas at Austin.

"The decision to suspend competition was not a decision we took lightly," UIL Executive Director Dr. Charles Breithaupt stated. "Much effort and consideration was given to resurrect the regional track meets and change the dates for the state meet. With the cooperation of our regional sites and the University of Texas, we are now able to hold the regional and state track meets as we had originally intended."

On April 29, the UIL announced that the state track meet would be held May 14-16 and that qualifiers would come from the top four participants in each event from each region.

"At that time we were simply trying to save the state meet," Breithaupt. "When our staff had

the time, opportunity and information they were able to make this happen. We had numerous calls in support of the original decision as well as calls to return to the regional format. We also know that additional conflicts may occur because of these changes, however, we believe this schedule represents the best opportunity for the most students."

Nine McGregor Bulldogs and four Lady Bulldogs will advance to the Regional Track Meet at Stephenville this Friday and Saturday.

The McGregor Bulldog track team captured first place at the district meet held recently while the Lady Bulldogs tied for seventh in the team division.


The top three in each event advance to the regional meet and the top two at regional earn a trip to state.

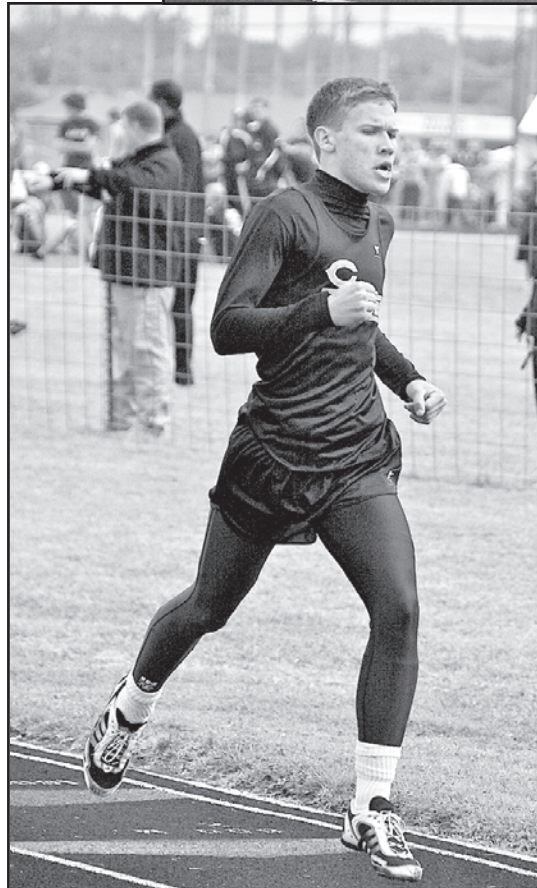

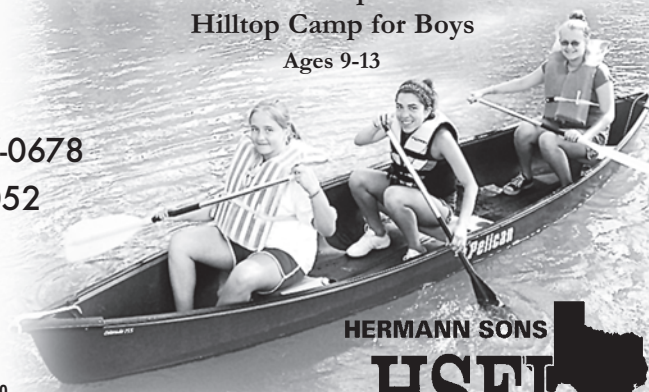

I can only imagine, that day as Jesus walked down the street, the people pressing all around him, trying to get a glimpse, and the lady, squeezing between people, may be on her knees crawling at times pushing her way to Jesus. Her mission was clear, she needed to touch the hem of Jesus clothes, and she would be healed. Finally making it to the Lord, she touched him, and was never the same. She felt the healing go through her body, and the power was released from the Lord. He stopped and asked who touched him? With all of the people around Jesus that day and probably touching Him, this woman's faith caused him to stop. He explained to her that her faith made her well! It was the touch!

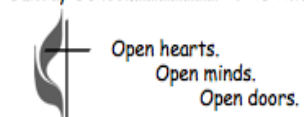

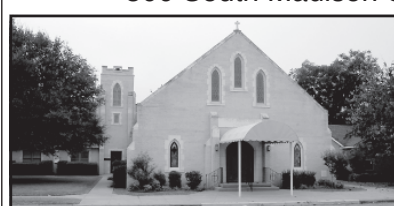

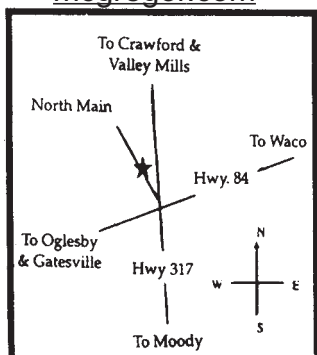
