The Third Annual Relay for Life celebration set another record-breaking amount totaling 81,058.00 last Friday night and Saturday morning, May 19 and 20 at Bulldog Stadium.

The weather was great, as the communities of McGregor, Oglesby and Crawford joined together to make this third Relay for Life a success. Twenty-four teams pitched tents and decorations to "Rock and Roll" and find a cure for cancer. Teams from all different ages and backgrounds joined in the festivities.

The top three fund-raising teams in the family and friends division were: first place-The Wild Bunch, second place-Flaming Floozies and third place-Mixed Nuts.

In the business division, Ferguson/Overnite placed first. Second place was Lady Rockets and third went to McGregor Fire Department/EMS.

Other awards presented were: Best Decorated Tent Site: Ferguson/Overnite; Most Spirited Team: Papa's Bakers, Lella Family; Best Team Baton: Flaming Floozies-Red Hat Club and Best T Shirt: Heartbreakers-John McClaren Chevrolet.

The night started with the honorary first lap, celebrating the survivors of cancer followed by the caretakers' lap. Then the Relay was underway with a member from each team walking throughout the night.

Rockin' Rick and the Corvettes entertained the crowd with their rock 'n roll music until the very special Luminary Service. When the lights went out, the stands were lined with the words HOPE and CURE along with luminaries surrounding the track

Local man arrested in shooting on Garfield

A McGregor man was arrested and charged with two counts of Attempted Murder following a shooting incident in the 600 block of Garfield Street last Thursday evening where approximately 12 to 13 shots were reportedly exchanged between officers and the suspect.

"Fortunately, no one was injured," McGregor Chief of Police Ron Watkins stated. "George Brown, Jr. of McGregor was arrested, charged with two counts of Attempted Capital Murder, and was transported to the McLennan County Jail under a total of \$100,000 bond, \$50,000 for each count."

The McGregor Police Department received a call approximately 9:15 p.m. about shots being fired in the 600 block of Garfield Street. When Officers Harlin Maloy and Crystal Stanford arrived at the scene and cautiously approached the residence from the side, they were reportedly met by gunfire from a rear bedroom window.

The McGregor police were assisted by united from the Department of Public Safety, Woodway, the Waco Sheriff's Office, and Moody.

With all of the police presence the man came out of the house and gave himself up. The suspect was

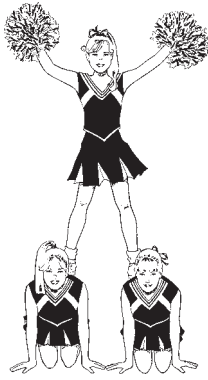
Prairie Chapel 5K Race Is Saturday

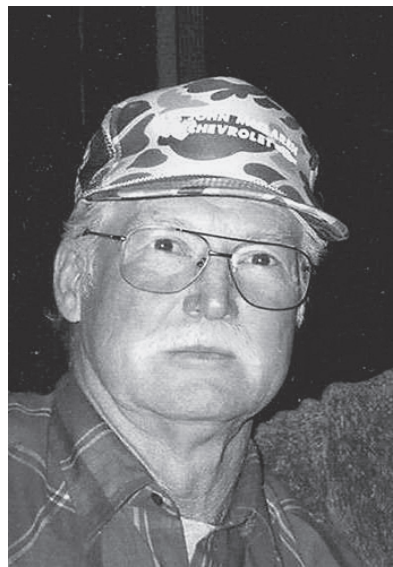

Consolidation plans move forward for McLennan-Bel-Falls Electric Co.

After a joint meeting on May 5, 2006, it was agreed by directors of both McLennan County Cooperative (MCEC) and Bel-Falls Electric Cooperative (BFEC) to move forward with consolidation plans of the neighboring organizations. The decision was reached after presentations by Rural Utilities Service (RUS) and Cooperative Finance Corporation (CFC) and representatives from United Cooperative Services.

"A combined entity would benefit from the larger economic scale, combined services, and more efficient operations," states Rick Haile, current CEO and General Manager of McLennan County. Mr. Haile is acting as an interim manager at Bell-Falls Electric as well. Members from both cooperatives would benefit greatly from the consolidation.

Benefits would include services that are not being offered currently to the BFEC area such as underground electrical and a turtle metering system. The merger would also prompt improved service and more stable rates. The consolidation would create a united cooperative serving almost 18,000 meters. Currently, BFEC serves 5,200 meters in the Bell, Milam, and Falls County; while MCEC serves 12,600 meters in McLennan, Bell, Falls, Coryell, Bosque, and Hamilton Counties.

Bel-Falls Electric was established in 1936 with an office located in Rosebud TX. The board of direc-

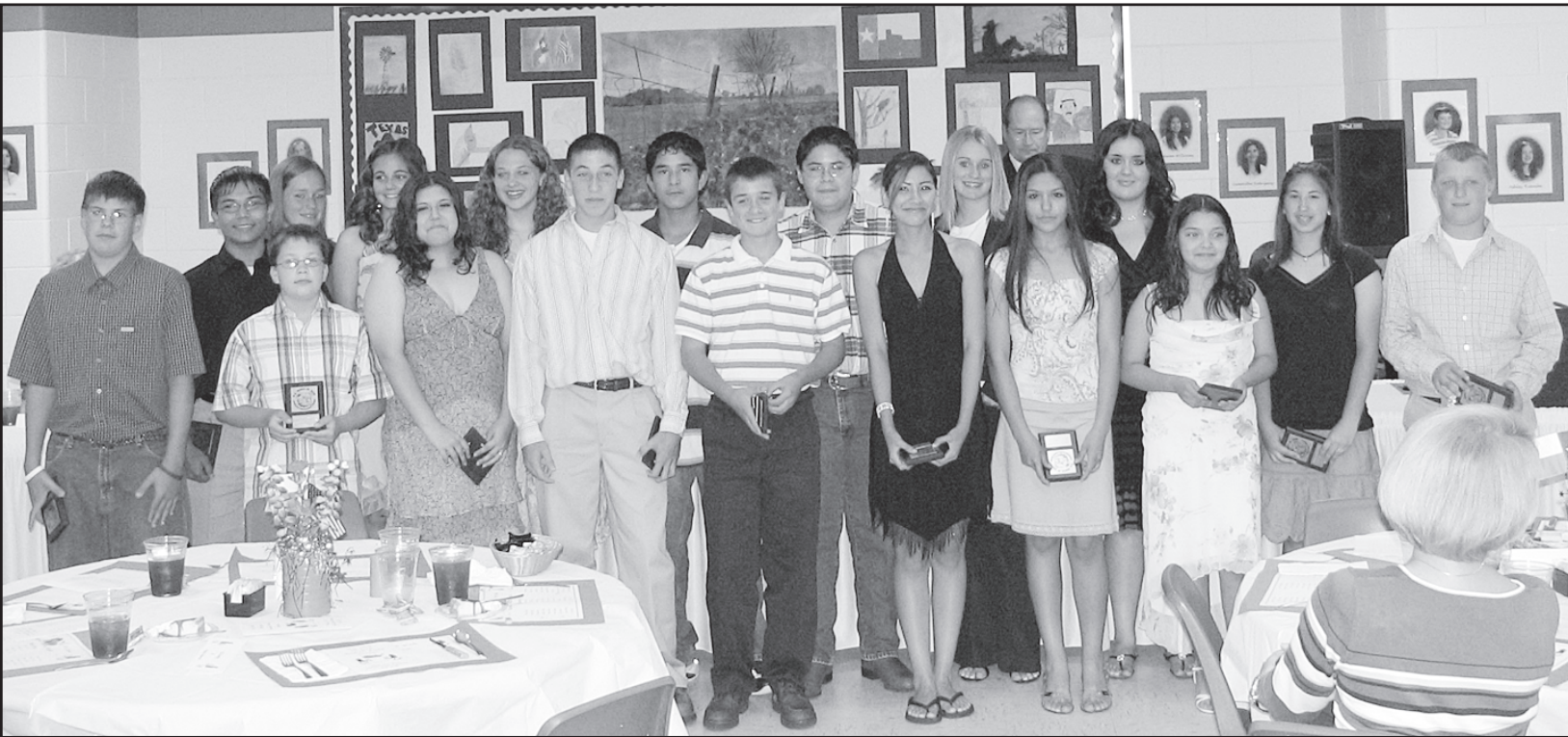

Principal Paul Miller stated, "The banquet is a wonderful opportunity for us to honor the young men

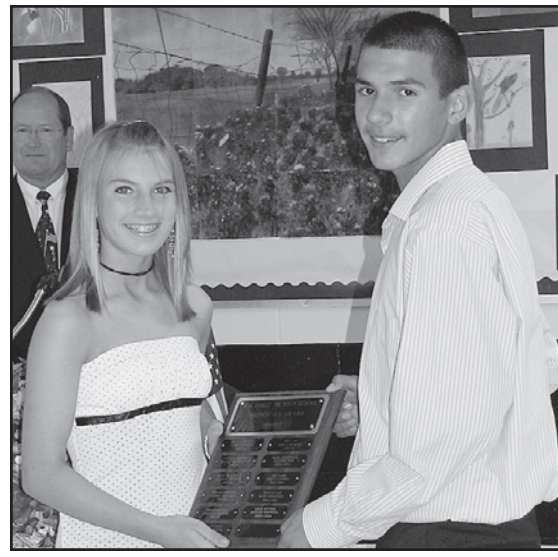

Everyday Theology

If you have everything figured out, don't bother to read any further. Just tell everyone who asks that you didn't need to read this column. There are much better uses of your time.

If, on the other hand, you still sometimes wonder if you really do have much grasp on reality, welcome to humanity! Even Bishop N.T. Wright, one of the leading theologians of our time, tells his students that he is wrong one-third of the time; he just never knows which third it is!

I sometimes provoke discussion on controversial topics by starting with the claim that "You ought to agree with me on this, because I am right!" On many of these same topics, I know my own understanding has changed over the years, sometimes even reversed itself. I handle this by saying "I am just more right now than I used to be."

Honestly, one really can't help

but think one is right; it is impossible to make a claim about what one believes and believe it to be wrong at the same time. Therefore, my claims to "rightness" are really not egotistical at all, but merely an admission that I am, in fact, thinking.

The more I grow as a Christian, though, the more I realize I have yet to learn. Sometimes when I learn new things they fit well with what I have already come to know. Sometimes, though, learning new things tears down matters and patterns of belief that I thought were settled.

For the foreseeable future, I will be preaching Sunday mornings on paradoxes of the Christian faith. There are many things we don't, won't, and can't entirely figure out. This used to concern me. Now I am ok with it, but I cannot rest from trying.

If there is one thing I know for sure, it is that we need one another to get things figured out.

ONE VOICE

"Greater love has no one than this that he lay down his life for his friends." That's the first proof of the friendship. Jesus says this on Thursday night when the disciples cannot really understand what he's talking about because they're still feeling the victory of Palm Sunday, when great crowds came out to see Jesus.

They don't know a conspiracy is brewing. They don't know that within hours Jesus will be arrested. They have to wait until later to understand what Jesus means. But at this point, he still makes the promise to them: He says, "I'm your friend."

Here's the ancient proof of friendship: the proof is what I do for you. Sometimes we put it crudely, but we use that ancient proof all the time. We test a friend by what he does for us. That's how you know a friend.

The second proof of friendship from our Lord's side is an expansion of the same principle. He says, I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned

from My Father I have made known to you."

There are also two proofs of friendship from our side. The first one took me off balance when I first read it. It doesn't seem like friendship. Listen to it: "My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this that he lay down his life for his friends. You are my friends, if you do what I command." When you love as I loved you, then you prove you're my friend.

The final proof of friendship is the proof of prayer. Jesus says, "The Father will give you whatever you ask in my name." That's the flip side of "I take you into my confidence." He says, "If you want to be my friend, take me into your confidence." Pray. The invitation to prayer is the final proof.

Have you ever thought of your prayer as proof of your friendship with Jesus? Pray. Ask favors. Use my name with the Father. That's exactly what the text says. You can ask the Father using my name. That's something a friend can do.
