## Dance studio to open Aug. 12 on Main Street

There will be dancing on Main Street beginning in August as Christine Hayes opens Central Texas Dance Academy at 324 S. Main. She will be offering tap, ballet and jazz to ages three to adult.

Central Texas Dance Academy will have its Grand Opening on Saturday, August 12, and everyone is invited to come take a free dance class. Hayes said there is no obligation to register that day, but if you do, \$10.00 will be taken off of September's tuition. Those wishing to take her up on the opportunity of a free class should call 840-2899 as free classes will be limited.

Hayes, who has been teaching dance for 13 years, is also offering a Boogie Baby class for the youngest of dancers—ages 18 months to three years. This class requires parent participation, and focuses on developing coordination skills through creative movement as well as timing concepts,

rhythm and spatial awareness.

Central Texas Dance Academy owner Christine Hayes said that her studio is committed to providing students a comprehensive dance education, meaning that students will not only learn how to dance, but will be presented an age appropriate knowledge of classical ballet terminology, translations, spelling and dance history. All classes are based on sound technique and solid fundamentals in a positive and encouraging atmosphere.

"I want to make sure each child is given the best possible dance experience," Hayes said. "The gift of dance requires dedication, discipline and energy to be successful. This combination will not only develop coordination and grace, but will teach positive attributes that will follow for life. Dance is an art rich in tradition and I am committed to pass this legacy on to all of my dancers."

## Two-a-days to start Monday for Bulldogs

McGregor football gridders will arrive early Monday morning for the start of two-a-day football workouts and the traditional Bulldog mile run.

Head Coach Tim Seward and his assistant coaches were attending coaching school this week. Since the school was being held in nearby Austin, Coach Seward decided it would be a good idea to include their wives on the trip this year.

The announcement was a big hit with the wives. When the coaches are attending the school, the wives can visit and shop, and then the coaches and their wives can dine out at night.

Athletes are expected to show up at the field house at 7:15 a.m. Equipment and shoes will be issued followed by the traditional Bulldog mile around 7:45 a.m.

The Bulldog mile was started many years ago as a way to usher in the new season and also see what kind of running shape the athletes were in.

Coach Seward reported that the morning workouts will be held from 7:30 a.m. to 8:45 a.m.

Reason for the short morning workout is that the coaches will be involved with inservice training and Coach Seward didn't want them to miss that.

Athletes will work on conditioning and weight training during the morning workouts. There will be not conditioning for the afternoon workouts scheduled from 4:15 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.

Following the evening workouts, the coaching staff and play-

ers will head for the McGregor Aquatic Center for a cool down. This is designed to help reduce muscle soreness.

"During the workouts we will be taking frequent water breaks," Coach Seward emphasized. "Times have changed from that old philosophy of taking just one drink for the entire practice. Water breaks are scheduled every 12 minutes and we will be handing out water bottles during drills."

First full pad workout is Friday, Aug. 11 from 8 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. For the first four days, athletes will be clad in T-shirts, shorts and helmets.

A short afternoon workout is planned from 5:45 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. and then it's time for a party.

"We're going to have some pizzas delivered and all of the athletes will be spending the night in the field house," Coach Seward stated. "The purpose of this overnight party is to build team unity. On Sunday morning we're planning on going as a group to a local church service."

For Bulldog fans starting to fill in their calendars, the Meet the Bulldogs is scheduled for Thursday, Aug. 17 at 6:30 p.m.

First Booster Club meeting is set for Aug. 14 at 6:30 p.m. at the field house.

Coach Seward wanted to emphasize that any athlete going into the 7th, 9th and 11th grades must have a physical completed before practice begins. Physical forms are available at the school.

## Lenamon cites initiatives to help achieve outcome

McGregor school board trustees watched a powerpoint presentation by High School Principal James Lenamon last Thursday evening listing areas of concern and some initiatives to aid in achieving the desired outcomes.

Some of the areas of concern included TAKS scores in math and science, faculty/student relationships, freshman transition, life-skills for upperclassmen, relevant curriculum in all subjects, and apathy.

In order to achieve the desired outcome, Lenamon said, "I believe the continued use of remediation classes, use of Kamico pre-assessment materials, and the implementation of a summer remediation program for 11th grade students would be very helpful. Other initiatives include reassignment of staff, assigning mentor groups, expansion of freshman orientation into a two day format, developing a freshman transition class, developing a Life Course 101 for juniors and seniors, participation in curricu-

lum mapping and vertical and horizontal planning of lessons."

Following his presentation Lenamon pointed out that about 50 students participated in the freshman orientation held recently.

While giving a District Operations Effectiveness Update, Superintendent Kevin Houchin asked for the board for input for long range planning for the junior high school. Board members requested that Supt. Houchin gather information for developing the junior high campus.

After reporting that the food service is in good shape, Supt. Houchin added, "I would like to raise the starting salary for food service employees to \$6.00 per hour."

"The current year budget is in good shape," Supt. Houchin noted. "The District will receive about \$445,000 from Fairfield ISD in August due to the Chapter 41/42 relationship with the district. McGregor ISD will also retain about \$35,000-\$40,000 in interest income earned due to the

relationship."

Although they are a little behind schedule, the new tennis courts should be ready soon.

Supt. Houchin pointed out to the board that little progress has been made in the goal of having personnel reflect the cultural and ethnic diversity of the District due to limited applicants.

Assistant Superintendent John Hudson addressed the board concerning the 2006-2007 school handbook.

"The proposed handbook contains the previously adopted dress code changes, a small addition to the electronic communication and data management policy, changes in the phrasing concerning participation in athletic extracurricular activities, and changes suggested by TASB Policy Service due to recent legislation," Hudson stated. "There were no suggested changes to the Student Code of Conduct. The District plans to separate the mandated information into two parts which will help safeguard information See SCHOOL on page 2

They also will get to hear each teacher's classroom expectations and obtain information about how best to contact them."

about students, but better allow them to get deserved public recognition for their accomplishments.”

The board approved the McGregor ISD Student Handbook for 2006-2007 as recommended.

Under personnel, the board extended contracts to John Briggs as a high school IPC (Integrated Physics and Chemistry) teacher/coach; to Cheryl Briggs as a resource teacher/coach and Christopher Kuhl as a high school IPC teacher/coach.

John Briggs will be an assistant football, assistant boy's basketball, and head golf coach this year.

Cheryl Briggs will be assistant girl's basketball, head cross country, and head softball coach.

Kuhl will be a junior high coach this year.

Supt. Houchin told the board

that Junior High math teacher Stacy Ainsworth will assume some coaching duties this year. She will be an assistant girl's coach in both basketball and track. He told the board that Ainsworth served as varsity assistant coach at Snook prior to accepting her current teaching position in McGregor.

The District is losing two PEIMS Coordinators due to family moves.

Laura Lam, who was employed at the elementary is moving to Whitney where her husband is now employed. Traci Driver, who was employed at the junior high, has moved with her family to Mexia.

Ratings for the District and campuses are expected to be released soon. The District is expected to be rated acceptable. The high school and junior high should have acceptable ratings and the elementary campus is expecting a recognized rating.

Supt. Houchin told board members that Sax Arts and Crafts catalogs has selected a piece by

Jenna Foster as a candidate for the fall cover of its Fine Art Catalog. The piece was selected by Texas Art Consultant Joe Culotta, from a CD received from the VASE director. Foster is a student of McGregor High School art instructor Lisa Carpenter.

A motion was made early in the meeting to select Williams, Cunningham, Shavers & Christensen, L.L.P., as the District Financial Auditor for the 2006-2007 school year.

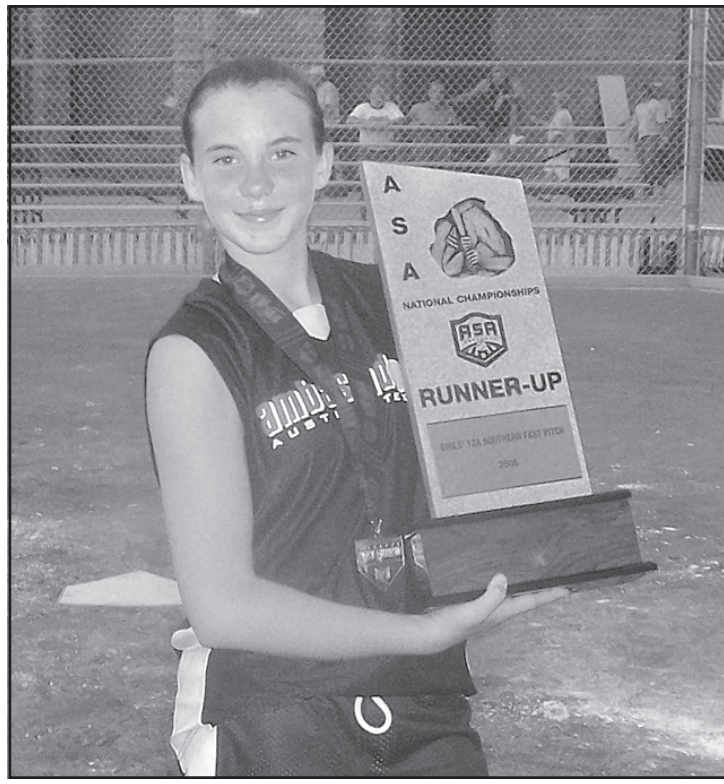

In her spare time, she enjoyed crocheting, traveling and being around little children.

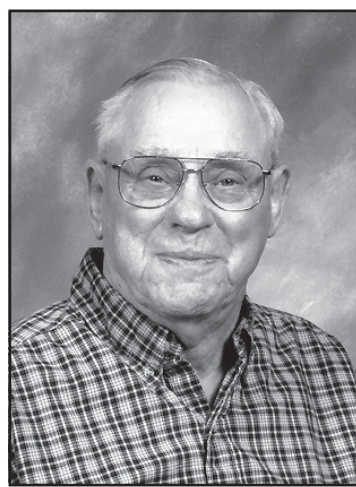
Preceding her in death were her parents and a brother, Franklin Hodel.

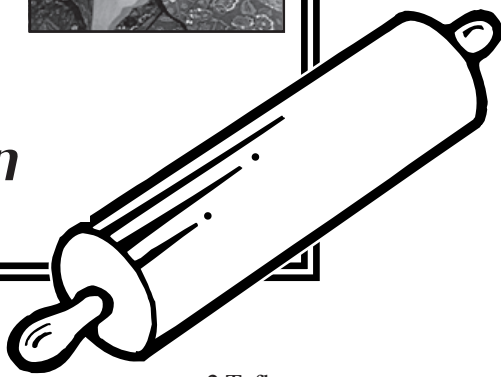

# Cooking With Teresa Sneed of Catering on Main



## Recipes that are just peachy

For the first time in six or seven years my Mom and I didn't get peaches this summer. We usually make the trip to Mound and buy several bushel baskets. The heat, lack of rain and the higher cost just made it less appealing and less plentiful for purchasing. The problem is there are no peaches left in my freezer!

I freeze my peaches, using fruit fresh and sometimes sugar. Last year I roped my daughter-in-law and granddaughter in to helping with the process. Kara, (daughter-in-law) and I did all of the peeling and slicing. Morgan, my nine-year-old granddaughter, wrote labels, showing amounts and sugar contents for the quart size freezer bags. We were really a great production crew!

Since I am thinking peaches, I have included some of my favorites for you this week. Hope your week is peachy and you enjoy these recipes.

### OLD FASHION PEACHY KEEN PRESERVES

2 cups fresh peaches, peeled and chopped  
1 cup sugar  
2 T. lemon juice  
Stir ingredients together in a saucepan. Stir constantly over

medium heat until peaches are clear and sugar is dissolved. Pack in jars while hot, leaving 1/4 inch space at top, into sterile canning jars. To seal, follow directions on canning jar box. Yield 3 cups

### "DOWN HOME" PEACH COBBLER

Pie crust for two pies  
6 cups fresh peaches, peeled and sliced  
1 1/4 cups sugar  
3 T. flour  
Cinnamon to liking  
1/2 stick butter  
Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Prepare pastry. Roll out 1/2 dough on floured surface. Line bottom of 2 quart Pyrex dish with pastry. Pour peaches in and cover them with other half of rolled pastry. Dot the dough with butter and sprinkle with sugar and cinnamon. Bake at 400 degrees for 40-50 minutes or until browned.

*The "Down Home" peach cobbler is my favorite, but this is one that is nice for a change.*

### BRAZOS PEACH PIE

Dough for 9 inch pie crust  
5 cups fresh peaches, peeled and sliced  
Custard:  
1 cup sugar

2 T. flour  
2 T. butter  
2 eggs, beaten  
Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Place peaches in crust. Mix custard ingredients together. Pour over the peaches. Bake for about one hour or until firm.

### PEACH ICE CREAM

6 eggs, separated  
3 cups sugar  
3 T. cornstarch  
3 (13-oz) cans evaporated milk  
1/2 tsp. salt  
3 cups water  
1 T. vanilla  
6 cups fresh peaches, thinly sliced

Beat egg yolks with a wire whisk. Add sugar, cornstarch, milk, salt and water, mixing well. Place in a sauce pan and simmer for 1 to 1 1/2 hours until thickened like custard. Strain custard after allowing to cool. Add vanilla, beaten egg whites and peaches. Place in ice cream freezer and freeze.

*This recipe was given to me by a friend who told me it came from an old cookbook of one of Waco's old families.*

*This last recipe is one of my favorites. Years ago when sweet/hot jellies became popular, I found this recipe in Fredericksburg and love making it and having it on hand. WARNING! Be very careful handling the peppers. Habanero peppers are very, very powerful! In fact, they will suck*

the air out of your lungs if you are not careful! It wouldn't hurt to use plastic gloves when handling the peppers.

### PEACH- HABANERO JELLY

3 1/2 pounds fresh peaches, (about 10-12) peeled and sliced  
1/2 cup water  
7 1/2 cups granulated sugar  
1 habanero pepper, stemmed, seeded and pureed (with water)  
6 ounces liquid fruit pectin  
In large saucepan add water to peaches. Heat to boiling point, stirring often with a wooden spoon. Reduce the heat and simmer, covered for 5 minutes. Remove from the heat and cool to room temperature.

Place a large square of cheesecloth, several layers thick, in a colander set over a mixing bowl. Pour the peach mixture into cheesecloth, bring the corners together and press tightly to extract all the liquid, about 3 1/2 cups. Return the juice back into the saucepan and add the lemon juice, sugar and Habanero. Heat to boiling, stirring constantly. Stir in the pectin and bring to a full rolling boil, boiling hard for one minute. Stir constantly. Remove from heat, skim off the foam and pour quickly into sterilized jars. Seal at once.

This jelly is delicious poured over cream cheese and served with crackers or crispy toasted bread. It is also great served over baked chicken breasts.

### QUICK AND EASY PEACH ICE CREAM

3 eggs  
1 1/2 cups sugar  
1 pint half and half  
2 T almond extract  
1/2 gallon milk  
6 cups of fresh peaches  
Beat the eggs, mix in the sugar. Add the half and half to mixture. Then pour in your peaches, almond extract. Put the mixture into the freezer and fill the remainder of the container with milk. Freeze. After freezing is finished, if you can, pack down the freezer with additional ice and let the ice cream ripen for about two hours.

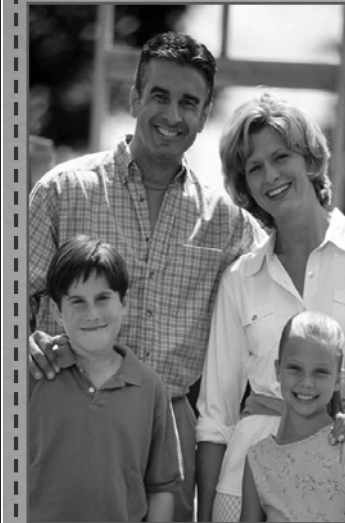

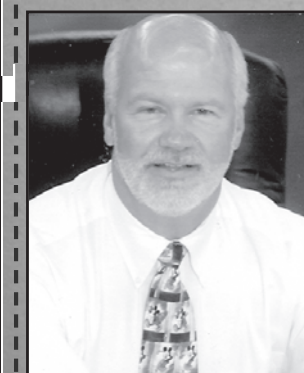

It Happened This Week . . . 10, 20, 30, 40, 50, 60, 70 Years Ago  
A look back at McGregor's Past —by Bonnie Mullens

**AUGUST 7, 1936—**  
• R.L. Summers announced plans to organize a cub scout program in McGregor.

**AUGUST 2, 1946—**  
• It is firmly believed by well informed groups of McGregor, Waco and Temple business circles the application of Texas A&M College will acquire the 18,500 acre site of the Bluebonnet Ordinance plant here for the purpose of establishing a large agriculture and livestock experiment station. The City also acquired an air field.  
• The building formerly occupied by Neff's Dry Goods was rented to an Oklahoma man who will open a White Auto Store.

**AUGUST 3, 1956—**  
• McGregor Hereford baseball team was named league champion. Pitcher Jack Gibson pitched a no hitter. Team members included Pat Kennerly, Ray Dean Elliott, Tommy Jones, Jeff Leavitt, Bobby Crelia, Jack Holt, L.H. Fathke, Bobby Kattness, Sam Pressler, Robert Walter, Mike Yeager, Ralph Bend and Wendell Arnold.  
• T.H. Jenkins announced schools would start September 4th after Labor Day. Jenkins said he had been asked often if H.G. Isbill would become a so-called junior high school. His answer was no. McGregor schools were set up on an 8-4 plan. Eight grades in grammar school and four in high school Jenkins said it was the school's purpose to house all five lower grades in the new school building. It is expected the new school would be filled to capacity when school opened. Lunchroom meal price was 25 cents.

• Mr. and Mrs. Layton Reeves won a "Holiday on Wings" from Roger Chamblee Used Cars on the basis of their 25-week reason when they bought their car in McGregor.  
• Excavation and leveling work started on the new \$235,500 First National Bank building at the corner of Fourth and Main. The Temple Housing Corporation expected to complete the building in 300 working days.  
• Lee Stockburger retired after 46 years as carrier of Route 1 mail in Oglesby.

**AUGUST 5, 1966—**  
• Following a reunion of the McGregor High School Class of 1941, class president Ida Kaelin was pictured with classmate Alton Janes and Supt. T.H. Jenkins in front of one of the two gas lights purchased by the class for the school.  
• Floyd Webb and Floyd Fehler were the two big names in McGregor farm news. Webb made county-wide news when he brought in McLennan County's first bale of cotton. Fehler brought in the finest grain sorghum yield thus far. He averaged 4,319 pounds per acre over 74.9 acres.  
• Temperatures recorded for the week were all over 100 degrees. Highest was 104 degrees.  
• McGregor High Bow Wows were notified of their first meeting of the year.  
• A sizeable variety of narcotics were stolen from the office of the late Dr. John Thompson. He died the week prior to the break-in.  
• George N. Elliott and Vicki Vowel exchanged wedding vows in McGregor.

**AUGUST 5, 1976—**  
• McGregor had the capability of pumping 1/4 million gallons of water a day due to its new well and reservoir, in addition to 900,000 gallons of storage. City Administrator Lonnie Muegge said city's water consumption was on par with winter months due to abnormal rainfall this summer.

**AUGUST 5, 1986—**  
• Margaret Amsler was selected to the Women's Hall of Fame by Governor Mark White.  
• High temperature on Sunday was a cool 80 degrees following a 1.73 inch rain. The community had experienced 11 days of 100-plus temperatures. A string of nine straight days had readings of up to 106 degrees.  
• McGregor's My-D Han-D baseball team won the little league championship. Team members were Robert Chambers, Spencer Webb, Jason Bush, Joshua Cox, Jonathan Zacharias, Chris Adams, Byron Jackson, Steven Bubert, John Goff, Quinton Freeman and Stephen Felan. Coaches were Ronnie Chambers and David Goff.

**AUGUST 1, 1996—**  
• The gates were now locked and the buildings were empty as of July 31st at the 9,000 acre naval weapons plant in McGregor. The facility had been home to eight companies since it opened in 1942 as the Bluebonnet Ordnance Plant. The final 46 employees left on July 31st. The Navy hired a caretaker firm from Tacoma, Washington to oversee the property.

# The Stargazer

## Perseid Meteor Shower

It's nearly time for the annual Perseid meteor shower, but don't get too excited. Usually one of the best showers, this year the Moon will wash out all but the brightest Perseids. The shower spans a 3-night period with the peak night coming Sat. evening/Sun. morning, Aug. 12/13.

A large gibbous Moon rises before 11 p.m., and with skies not getting dark until after 9 p.m., that doesn't leave much time for moonless meteor-watching. And to make matters worse, meteor showers are usually at their best after midnight by which time the Moon will be well up in the night sky.

But don't give up completely. It doesn't mean no meteors will be seen—just fewer since only the brighter ones will be visible against the moonlit night sky.

And with the Moon out, it won't be necessary for city folks to travel to rural areas for a better show as the Moon is the great equalizer that lights up everyone's sky. Rural areas, with less light pollution, usually reveal far more night sky objects, but when a bright Moon is out—

which is about half the time—it washes out the sky just as effectively as city lights.

But the Moon isn't always unwelcomed. Some 200 years ago when modern science was in its infancy, a group of English scholars, calling themselves the Lunar Society, held monthly scientific discussions. Sounding like a group of astronomers with special interest in the Moon, the Society actually included such luminaries as Erasmus Darwin (grandfather of Charles), James Watt (whose name measures electricity, e.g., a 60-watt bulb), Joseph Priestley (discoverer of oxygen) and even Benjamin Franklin during his periodic visits to England.

Their name derived from a more practical consideration than their wide ranging scientific interests. As there were no street lights then, they met each month on a night near the full Moon so they could see their way home. The Moon is notably brighter the five days surrounding full Moon; just 3 days before or after full, the sky is less than half as bright as when full.

Since the Perseids peak 3 days after the Aug. 9 full Moon,

it could be much worse. So as darkness falls, stretch out on a blanket or reclining lawnchair. The Moon rises in the east, so face west and start watching for those beautiful "falling stars."

**SKY CALENDAR:**  
\* 1 Tue.: Lammis, the cross-quarter day celebrating the middle of summer.

\* 1 Tue.: The Moon is below Jupiter.

\* 2 Wed.: The Moon is at 1st quarter.

\* 3 Thu. evening: The Moon is to the right of Antares, then the next evening to its left.

\* 9 Wed.: August's full Moon is called the Green Corn Moon, Grain Moon and Fruit Moon.

\* 15 Tue.: The Moon is at 3rd quarter.

\* 16 Wed. morning: The Moon is near the Pleiades.

\* 18 & 19 Fri. & Sat. mornings: Venus passes within two moonwidths of the Beehive star cluster low in the east just before dawn. (Use binoculars to see the cluster.)

**Naked-eye Planets:** Mars is low in the west at dusk while bright Jupiter is higher in the southwest. For the next three weeks Mercury is below much brighter Venus low in the east just before dawn, and coming closest Aug. 10.

**No Mars Spectacular:** It's circulating on the Internet again, but don't believe it—Mars is not about to come spectacularly close to Earth nor will it look as large as the full Moon. Each summer since Mars' close pass in August 2003 this email starts coming around again. It's a great reminder that we can't believe everything we read on the Internet.
