## McGregor General Store plans are announced

McGregor will have a new retail business along Highway 84 East in the near future called the McGregor General Store.

The premier store will sell a variety of Purina feeds including livestock, wildlife, pet food and much more.

A sign, with a picture of the attractive store front, was erected on the property Tuesday afternoon. The store will be constructed on three acres with an option to expand two acres to the north. The store's location is a couple of lots west of Granite Ford.

Principal owners are David Glass from Elgin, Jerry White from Valley Mills, Mike Jones from Valley Mills, and Ed Fehler of McGregor.

"When we looked for someone to run the business three things quickly came to mind," Fehler emphasized. "The first criteria was that customer service must be number one. The second point is they needed to understand the farm and ranch style business. This business can be seasonal and is under the mercy of mother nature. The business is affected by what's happening with the weather and the markets."

The third point, Fehler mentioned was that hopefully they would find someone who had the

experience and knowledge of products and programs offered by Land of Lakes Purina Feed.

Fehler and Tom McPherson

purchased the McGregor Farm Center on March 1, 1979. He said they have always prided themselves with providing great cus-

tomers service and knowing their customers by name. That's something they love about living in a small town.

"We plan to keep the McGregor Farm Center open to serve our customers," Fehler said. "It will be operated by the McGregor General Store LLC. This business wasn't made overnight and it won't be dismantled overnight."

Construction on the 21,000 square foot building is expected to start within 90 days with completion six months after the start.

"This makes the fourth store in Texas," Glass stated. "We have stores in Elgin, Speegleville, one on construction in Rockdale, and now one in McGregor. We are real excited about our future in McGregor. The McGregor Farm Center has been in business a long

time, and we want to help carry it to the next level."

Glass said it is a win-win situation for the community and he wants the employees of the McGregor store to be a part of community activities. The new store will start with 12 employees.

"We've studied the demographics and we believe we are at the right place at the right time," Glass commented. "This is such a growing area and there is such a good pool of workers to draw from."

The new store will be open seven days a week. Joe Paschall of Paschall, Skipper and Associates handled the real estate transaction.



EMPLOYEES OF IESI have been busy this week getting out their trash containers to their McGregor customers. The local solid waste management company began servicing McGregor residents in July. IESI will continue picking up trash in other containers and boxes other than those being delivered for another month or so.

Our families were also there and all helped take care of her and say their final good bye. I held Lindsey and although I stood helpless with a broken heart, at the same time staying strong for Lindsey, as we watched Rhonda fade away. I only wished love could have cured her. With the help of God, it is now time to move forward.

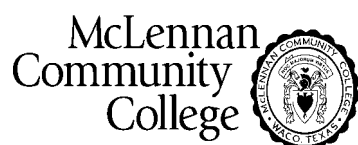

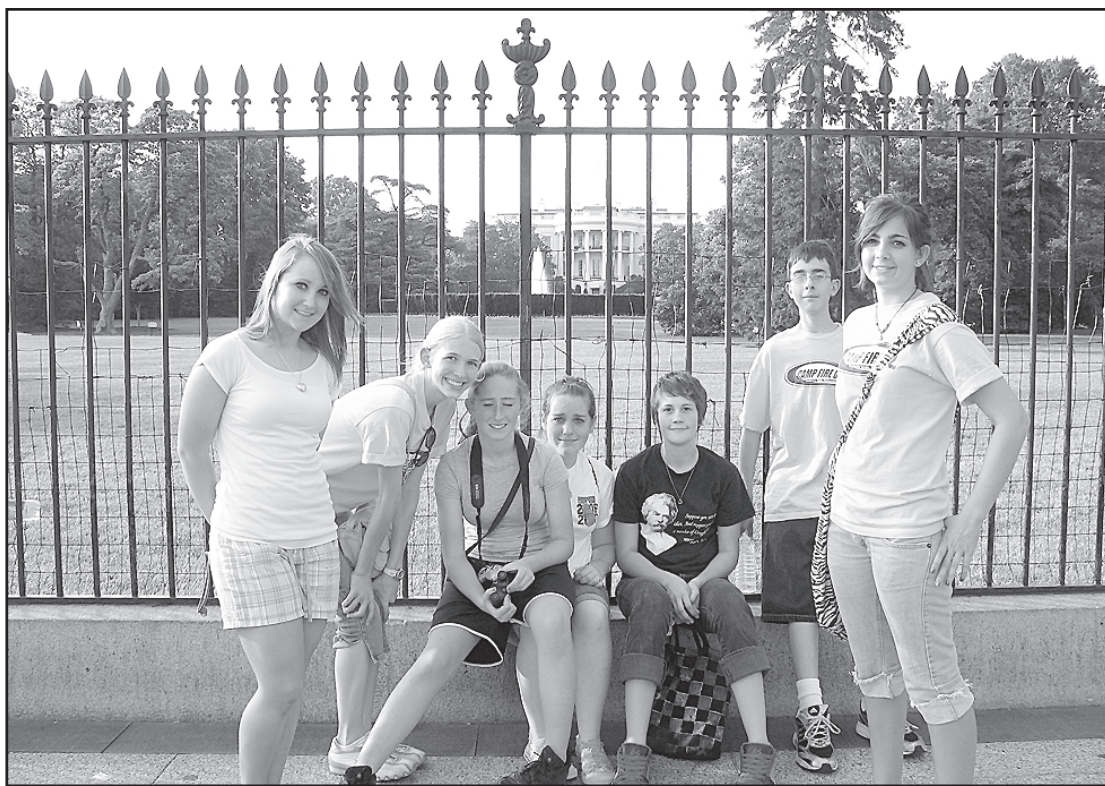
The week following high school graduation, members of the McGregor Campfire group boarded a commercial jet and spent a memorable fun-filled week in our nation's capital.

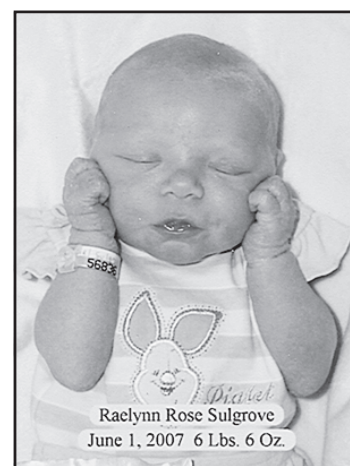

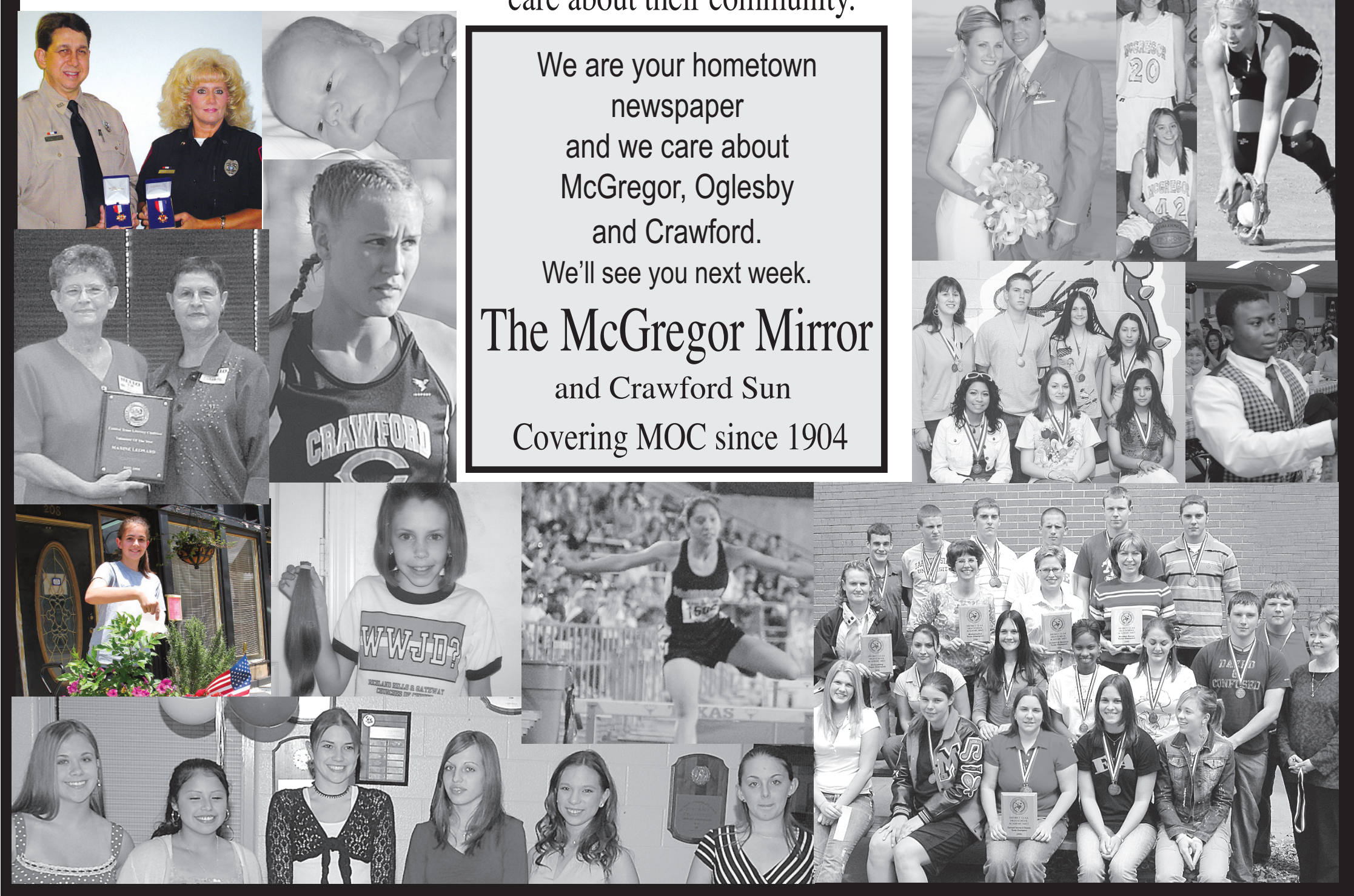

# McGregor's NWIRP remediation project received 2006 NAVAIR environmental award

The Naval Air System Command's (NAVAIR) Naval Weapons Industrial Reserve Plant (NWIRP) McGregor remediation project received the 2006 Chief of Naval Operations and the Secretary of the Navy Environmental Awards for environmental installation restoration during ceremonies at the Navy Heritage Center in Washington last month.

The project also received an honorable mention from the Secretary of Defense.

The NWIRP McGregor facility was one of NAVAIR's government-owned/contractor-operated (GOCO) properties. When the McGregor mission ceased, NAVAIR partnered with the Naval Facilities Engineering Command Southeast (NAVFAC SE) to begin environmental cleanup of the property.

The McGregor project team, which also includes members from the Environmental Protection Agency, the Texas Council on Environmental Quality, and contract partners EnSafe and CH2M Hill, wrapped up a 14-year remediation project over the past year. The team achieved several Navy firsts that have set new standards for environmental remediation.

"This project is the new precedent for all future divestitures," said Joe Kaminski, NAVAIR's GOCO program manager. "The remediation effort and awards recognition is outstanding, but even more so is knowing that we've done the right thing and we've done it well."

NAVAIR's Infrastructure Business Operations (AIR-7.10) manages the GOCO program and is charged with cleaning up and divesting these inactive properties. The program's ultimate goal is to produce economic development opport-

unities for the communities where these properties reside. But before any property can be turned over, it must first meet strict environmental standards that define a property as "suitable for transfer."

Perhaps the most prominent of all project accomplishments, NWIRP McGregor is distinguished throughout the entire U.S. Navy for being the very first Navy facility to receive the EPA's Ready for Reuse (RfR) Determination. An RfR verifies that environmental conditions at the property are protective of human health and the environment for current and future commercial, industrial and agricultural uses.

Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Navy (Environment) Donald R. Schregardus signed the RfR certificate and accepted the EPA determination on behalf of the Navy last October. "The McGregor remediation and redevelopment project is a powerful demonstration of the Navy's commitment to ensuring a safe environment for future generations," said Schregardus.

Captain Bill Cords, AIR-7.10 director, knows he needs to rely on more than just the Navy's good intentions and technology to achieve this goal; it takes a united community approach from local citizens and state and federal regulators. "Our success can be attributed to a strong public and private partnership, a determined and forward-thinking community, and a progressive and innovative government all working together in a spirit of cooperation," said Cords.

NWIRP McGregor has found a new life as the McGregor Industrial Park, which has brought fresh opportunities and an invigorated economy - creating over 1,000 jobs in the rural Texas town of 6,000.

"The team has been remarkable," said Mark Craig, NAVFAC SE Remedial Project Manager. "We had our fair share of challenges to overcome and we all worked together for solutions. It's an incredibly rewarding experience to work successfully toward a common goal, achieve that goal, and to know that this project is a model for future remediation projects."

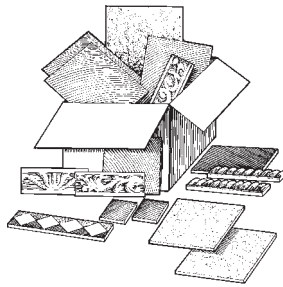

Children need healthy meals to learn. Crawford Independent School District offers healthy meals every school day. Breakfast costs \$1.00/\$1.00; lunch costs \$2.00/\$2.25. Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced-price meals. Reduced price is .30 for breakfast and .40 for lunch.

- 1. Do I need to fill out an application for each child?** No. Complete the application to apply for free or reduced-price meals. Use one Free and Reduced-Price School Meals Application for all students in your household. We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information. Return the completed application to: Eleanor Dreyer, Director of Food Service, 200 Pirate Drive, Crawford, Texas 76638, (254) 486-2381.
- 2. Who can get free meals?** Children in households getting Food Stamps or TANF and most foster children can get free meals regardless of your income. Also, your children can get free meals, if your household income is within the free limits on the Federal Income Guidelines.
- 3. Can homeless, runaway and migrant children get free meals?** Please call Kevin Noack, Supt. (254) 486-2381 to see if your child(ren) qualify, if you have not been informed that they will get free meals.
- 4. Who can get reduced price meals?** Your children can get low cost meals if your household income is within the reduced-price limits on the Federal Income Chart, shown on this application.
- 5. Should I fill out an application if I got a letter this school year saying my children are approved for free or reduced-price meals?** Please read the letter you got carefully and follow the instructions. Call the school at 254 486-2381 if you have questions.
- 6. I get WIC. Can my child(ren) get free meals?** Children in households participating in WIC may be eligible for free or reduced-price meals. Please fill out an application.
- 7. Will the information I give be checked?** Yes, we may ask you to send written proof.
- 8. If I don't qualify now, may I apply later?** Yes. You may apply at any time during the school year if your household size goes up, income goes down, or if you start getting Food Stamps, TANF or other benefits. If you lose your job, your children may be able to get free or reduced-price meals.
- 9. What if I disagree with the school's decision about my application?** You should talk to school officials. You also may ask for a hearing by calling or writing to: Kevin Noack, Superintendent, Crawford Independent School District, 200 Pirate Drive, Crawford, Tx 76638, 254-486-2381.
- 10. May I apply if someone in my household is not a U.S. citizen?** Yes. You or your child(ren) do not have to be a U.S. citizen to qualify for free or reduced-priced meals.
- 11. Who should I include as members of my household?** You must include all people living in your household, related or not (such as grandparents, other relatives or friends). You must include yourself and all children who live with you.
- 12. What if my income is not always the same?** List the amount that you normally get. For example, if you normally get \$1000 each month, but you missed some work last month and only got \$900, put down that you get \$1,000 per month. If you normally get overtime, include it, but not if you get it only sometimes.
- 13. We are in the military, do we include our housing allowance as income?** If your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income. All other allowances must be included in your gross income.

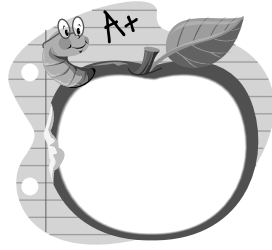

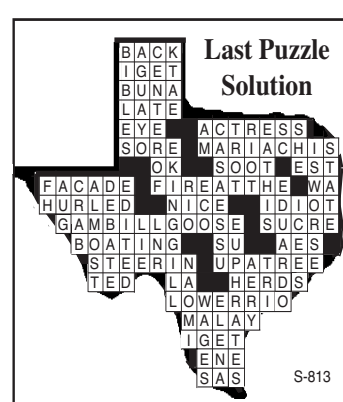

Her dad was smart and funny . . . and an alcoholic. Jeannette Walls' memoir *The Glass Castle* tells of her admiration for her father and the pain suffered at his constant loss of jobs, loss of temper, and loss of self-control. Walls recounts the story of her tenth birthday. As a present her dad promised he'd do anything she asked of him if it were humanly possible. Jeannette hesitated to make her request, finally, after much earnest encouragement from her father she said, "Do you think you could maybe stop drinking?" And he did. For a while.

As he recovered, Jeannette's sister said it wouldn't last. "This time it will," replied Jeannette. "How do you know?" her sister asked. "It's his present to me," she said. Sadly, Jeannette's sister was right.

I think about Walls' story and imagine her disappointment at the broken promise - but at the same time I am not surprised. We never get a grip on ourselves without

others nearby to hold on to us as well - to hold us up, to hold us accountable. Personal transformation rarely happens in private.

Driving in the mountains you will see large yellow signs that say RUNAWAY TRUCK RAMP AHEAD. The runaway truck ramp is a massive incline or wall of sand. It is there for trucks that can't stop. What it would really be like to be the driver, to be unable to stop, totally out of control. What is it like to find a place where you know you can get off the road and there is something to stop you? It won't be easy or fun - but you'll stop and you'll live. Thank God for runaway truck ramps.

The church is like a runaway truck ramp. Too many think the church is for everyone who has good brakes; for people who make their way through life holding their lane and keeping the speed limit. But what about those who are careening down hill, not knowing how to stop? Where do they look for help?

In the church we can get the support we need to keep from going air-born off the side of a mountain. Thank God for runaway truck ramps . . . and thank

God for creating a community that helps us do what we cannot manage to do on our own. *The fruit of the Spirit is . . . self-control* (Gal. 5:23).

## DISBURSING ASSETS
